

**walk the Walk in Ansty!**



The parish of Ansty has some of the most beautiful public rights of way (PROWs) in the county of Wiltshire - crossing varied landscapes including chalk and greensand hills flanked by clay coombes all connecting points of much interest. The footpaths are all fully accessible and carefully waymarked.

When out walking along our footpath gems one regularly comes across other local walkers and visitors alike marvelling at the scenes and the ease with which they can travel although not so many encounters seem to be with Ansty folk – young or old! A couple of short daily circuits are well used by some locals to walk their dog(s) close to the village but the best of the rest of our paths seem a step too far for most!

Why not resolve to try and walk some if not all of our paths in 2018 at least once! There are 18 parish footpaths to choose from: some are very short; some are easy to walk whilst others can be quite a challenge! We have almost 6 miles (about 9.5 km) of footpaths or bridleways to explore.

Step into history and walk along footpaths that have been there for hundreds, indeed in some cases, thousands of years! Admire the scenery; enjoy the tranquillity and relish the fact that we 'have it all' in our own fabulous parish! You will love it!
